	<p><u>Grammar</u></p> <p>Singular and Plural</p>	<p><u>Introduction with Picture:</u></p> <p>Introduce singular and plural nouns using a picture filled with interesting things. Encourage the child to talk about what they see. For example, they may say "cat." If there's more than one cat, ask how many. Discuss singular and plural forms. Share other examples like one marker, many markers, one pencil, many pencils, and encourage them to identify singular and plural forms.</p> <p><u>Sorting Game:</u></p> <p>Provide a mix of singular and plural noun cards.</p> <p>Ask the child to sort them into two piles, one for singular and one for plural. Encourage discussion about why each word belongs to its respective category. Talk about the sorting process, share thoughts on challenging words, and encourage them to ask questions.</p> <p><u>Story Building:</u></p> <p>Discuss how the story would change if all the nouns were either singular or plural.</p>

		<p>Share ideas, talk about creative choices, and encourage them to share their own stories.</p> <p>Scavenger Hunt:</p> <p>Create a list of singular and plural nouns.</p> <p>Have the child go on a scavenger hunt around the house, finding items that match the nouns on the list.</p> <p>Discuss whether the items are singular or plural.</p> <p>Encourage them to talk about their findings, share interesting discoveries, and ask questions.</p> <p>Sentence Construction:</p> <p>Provide the child with a mix of singular and plural nouns. Ask them to create sentences using the nouns and ensure they understand the concept of subject-verb agreement. Talk about their sentences, share feedback on correct usage, and encourage them to express their ideas.</p>	<p>Singular and Plural Noun - True or false (wordwall.net)</p> <p>Collaborate with the child to create a short story using both singular and plural nouns. 	<p><u>Alliteration</u></p> <p>To recognise alliteration and use it in their writing.</p>	<p>Alliteration is when a <u>sentence</u> or <u>phrase</u> has many <u>words</u> that start with the same sound. It is a <u>tongue-twisters</u>. Basically, the first consonant repeats itself throughout the sentence.</p> <p>Examples:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Go and gather the green leaves on the grass.2. Please put away your paints and practice the piano. <p>The big bad bear and baby bunnies by the bushes.</p> <p><u>Activity: A sound story</u></p> <p>Pick a sound for example, let's say the sound is 's'. Then make up a story with lots of 's' sounds in.</p> <p>Tell your child 'If you hear a 's' then put your hands on your heads.'</p> <p>An example of a story could be...'One day Steve the Snake went to the sandy beach. Share and talk about their creative choices. Have your child share their rhyming sentences with family or friends and encourage them to discuss what they enjoyed.</p>


	<p>To solve problems involving counting, addition, and subtraction.</p> <p>To identify quarter of a shape and a set of objects or numbers.</p>	<p>can be divided equally into two groups with no leftovers is called even number. The numbers 2, 4, 6, 8, and 0 are all even numbers. An odd number cannot be shared equally into two groups and has leftovers. The numbers 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 are all odd numbers.</p> <p>Encourage and discuss with your child while travelling or cooking. Share simple examples of addition and subtraction number stories. Focus on the use of different vocabulary of addition and subtraction.</p> <p>E.g.: You see 12 red cars and 4 black cars. How many cars altogether?</p> <p>I gave you 25 cookies, you ate 2. How many remaining?</p> <p>Encourage them to use recycled paper and cut out different shapes, fold the shape into half. 

Encourage your child to name and locate the Equator and the North and South Pole on the globe.




