

WHAT IS THE EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE??


The Early Years Foundation Stage (E.Y.F.S.) is the stage of education for children from birth to 5 years



READING IN FS1

- We encourage children to picture read the books.
- In a typical day at school, we follow 'Read 5 a Day' book policy.
- We have a reading area where children can choose a book of their interest and read with their friends.
- We also take children outdoors to read such as in our school garden area and on reading field trips.
- We invite parent volunteers, reading buddies, older siblings and grandparents to read and listen to the children.
- We introduce the letter sounds in Term 2 and by end of FS1, most children start reading two and three letter words and are confident to blend different sounds.

READING IN FS 2




In FS2, we follow the **Oxford Reading Tree Scheme**.

The ORT books are sent home every week along with the **Take Home** cards.

These books are levelled starting with picture reading and then to simple words and sentences.

Individual reading happens once a week and class reading happens every day. Your child will be given the opportunity to "read" their book in school and when they have read to us, we will write a comment in their record book. It is important that you sign their reading record book and write a comment when they have read to you.

We also invite parent volunteers, reading buddies, sixth form students, and older siblings to read and listen to the children.



EDUCATION

ASSESSMENT, RECORDING AND REPORTING

- Teachers build up their assessments throughout the year on a cumulative basis, from on-going learning and teaching.
- They make regular assessments, observations and recordings of children's learning, and we use this information to ensure that future planning reflects identified needs.
- Look, Listen and Note
- Observations of children help them to assess the progress which children are making and to decide where children are in their learning and development and to plan what to do.
- At the end of every term, we report if your child is working at the 'Emerging' 'Emerging Plus' or at the 'Expected' 'Expected Plus' Level.
- At the end of FS2, we report on the 17 Early Learning Goals (ELG) as Emerging, Emerging Plus, and Expected, Expected Plus.

HEALTH AND SAFETY GUIDELINES

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

- To ensure your child's attainment and progress, it is imperative that your child maintains a healthy attendance record.
- Since attainment and progress is directly linked to attendance, we expect all children to be regular and punctual to school and to their lessons. We expect them to have at least 96% attendance per term.

- The latest your child should arrive by is 7:30 am in school. The school gate closes by 7:35 am.
- Students entering the class after 7:40 am will be marked late and late SMS will be sent to the parents.

SELF CARE SKILLS

Many everyday tasks need to be practiced, such as:

- Can eat lunch or a snack without assistance, such as putting a straw in a juice box and opening a lunch box.

- Unity and team spirit




WELL- BEING

SAFEGUARDING AND CHILD PROTECTION

Safeguarding is the action that is taken to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm.

Safeguarding means:

- protecting children from abuse and maltreatment
- preventing harm to children's health or development
- ensuring children grow up with the provision of safe and effective care
- taking action to enable all children and young people to have the best outcomes.

Child protection is part of the safeguarding process.

It focuses on **protecting individual children** identified as suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. This includes **child protection procedures** which detail how to respond to concerns about a child





- A child's behaviour can help us determine if there are concerns.
- ✓ Most importantly- the child's voice is what will guide us.
 ✓ Embedding a safeguarding culture of care, support,
- listening allows us to differentiate between behaviours concerns and safeguarding concerns.

Children can present their work through drawing and encourage them to express their ideas and build vocabulary.

Jolly Phonics - /h/ and /r/

This week, we learnt letter sounds /h/ and /r/. Each letter sound was introduced with a story, song and an action. Students played games like mystery box. feed the monster, bingo game, memory game, peg the correct sound to pick and point to the object having the letter sound at the beginning, middle or end. They attempted to blend and read 2 and 3 letter words like cat, kit, pet, hat, rat, hit and were encouraged to read sight words- 1, the, is, to, go. They were prompted to continue the rhyming string with a word and make alliterative words. Stories

Our little learners enthusiastically participated in **International Mother Language day** by expressing their love for school in their mother tongue and native language. Literacy:

This week we discussed- 'How the world goes around?' Children shared their interesting understanding and role of various community helpers they see around. They drew and spoke about them in detail, children were challenged to draw the equipment used by people who help us and the signs associated with them for example policemen, firefighters, doctors etc. **Communication and Language:** Children enjoyed listening to stories on community helpers. They enjoyed reciting songs related to the people who help us. They were encouraged to reply using complex sentences like using and, because as they discuss.

Mathematics: Children were encouraged to give mathematical meanings to whatever was drawn by them. They were asked to count objects in their drawing, to create a shopping list and draw scoops of ice-cream on cones and later counted how many they have drawn. Physical Development: Children sang and danced to action songs like 'Wiggle it'. Later they were asked to place their palm near their heart to feel how is it beating faster/slow. Children were made aware of the changes in their body after doing strenuous exercises like sweating, feeling thirsty and tired.
