


Literacy	 <p>Spellings:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To spell words with 'u' sound spelt 'ou'. To use words with the suffix -ation.  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To add prefix -in to words to mean 'not'. 	<p>A prefix is a group of letters that can be added to the beginning of a root word.</p> <p>A suffix is a group of letters that can be added to the end of a root word.</p>  <p>Discuss using the prefix -in to mean 'not' and using the suffix -ation to turn verbs into nouns. If the verb ends in e, remove the e before adding -ation.</p> <p>Encourage your child to find words ending with -ation in stories or news articles and words -in as prefix e.g: tolerant- if 'in' is added at the beginning becomes intolerant which means the opposite of being tolerant.</p> <p>Practice using the words in sentences.</p>  <p>Prepositions</p>	<p>Spellings</p> <p>Prefix</p> <p>Suffix</p> 



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Grammar:

- To use **prepositions** of time and place.
- To use **connectives** to join sentences.

Share with your child that the things in your room are in right places. Some items are in different positions, and you need your child's help to express the right position of the objects.

This activity takes some preparation. You will have to move some things around. For example, you could place some books under a chair, put a clock in a pan, put the fruit basket on a chair or place the CD player behind the door.

Discuss with your child the objects that have been moved around.

Encourage your child to use 'prepositions of place' to make sentences with the place of objects where they are placed.

Encourage your child to choose different connectives to extend sentences.

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Text Level:

Non Fiction- Writing an Informal letter

Friendly letters have five parts:

- The Heading
- The Salutation (greeting)
- The Body
- The Closing
- The Signature



Encourage your child to identify adverbs of Manner when performing actions.

Example –

1. Sally walked **gingerly**.
2. The policeman whistled **loudly**.
3. She **often** walks home from her school.
4. He **never** keeps his books back on the shelf.
5. She looked **very** pretty in her new dress.

Encourage your our child to play the Board game –Have you ever?

Talk to your child about the different letters that they have received / sent, from / to your close ones.

Encourage your child to read variations of letters. (letters to friends and family who are far away from home; persuasive letters to their librarian requesting that specific texts to be added to the school library; letter to their favourite author, email, letter to the editor of a kid magazine)

Plan a small party at home, where the child will be in charge of the invitations.





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- To write different variations of letters e.g. – informal, invitation letter, thank you, response, etc.
- To retell a story in a letter.
- To read examples of letters written for a range of purposes, e.g. to recount, share, explain, enquire, complain, congratulate.
- To understand structure and layout including use of paragraphs, ways of starting, ending, etc. and ways of addressing different audiences – formal/informal.

Moral Education:

Different situations and changing feelings.

Why is it important to share our feelings?

Share with your child the details of the party so that the same can be included in the invite.

Talk to your child about how emotions and feelings are an important part of who we are. Ask children to name some feelings, for example, joyful, calm, worried, upset, loved, friendly and peaceful.


Share with your child how it always helps to talk about how you feel and it helps us feel better. **Encourage** your child to express how they feel in words which in turn, will help them to **manage** their feelings better with **self-control**. Give this example, if your sibling takes a toy you like, instead of getting angry, say, "Next time do ask me if you'd like to play with my toy."

Measurement

To solve word problems involving real life weights.

Measurement- Capacity (l and ml) :

- To know the relationships between liters and milliliters; choose and use appropriate units to estimate, measure and record measurement

- To read scales to the nearest 100 ml and also to know how many ml are equal to $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, and $\frac{1}{10}$ of 1 litre.
- To add and subtract capacities using liters and ml.

Talk to your child about the relationship between kilograms and grams and their use in daily life. Then, play a game of “I Spy” with your child, with a focus on weight. For example, you might say “I spy with my eye an object that weighs 2g” or “I spy with my eye an object that is heavier than a kg.” Then have your child predict which object you’ve chosen by estimating and check the prediction with a scale. Have your child write down the objects and their measurements. Then, switch roles!

Share items such as fruits, vegetables and pasta and let your child weigh. Have him/her hold an object in the hand and guess how much it might weigh before putting it on the scale. Examples: How much two apples will weigh as opposed to one apple, or how much a cup of cooked pasta will weigh as opposed to dry pasta

Share, Talk and Encourage –Give five or six containers and ask your child to estimate, measure and record their measurements. Now tell them to compare their readings and find out the difference between the capacity of any two containers.

Encourage your child to record the measurements of a coffee cup, glasses, a large juice container, a medicine

UNIT – HELPING PLANTS GROW WELL

Talk to your child about different types of plants they see around. Ask them how are they different from each other. Encourage them to focus on the different types of stem – some plants like climbers and creepers have weak stem where as a palm tree has strong trunk, compare the



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<p>Science</p>	<p>To identify and name different plants in the environment and compare them.</p> <p>To describe the functions of various parts of plants that is stem, leaves, flowers and roots.</p> <p>To explain the function of roots as an important part of a plant.</p> <p>To identify two different types of roots.</p> <p>To investigate factors affecting plant growth.</p>	<p>leaves of different plants – cactus, date palm, shrubs, bushes etc. Show your child pictures of plants growing in swamps e.g. mangroves where the roots grow above the ground to enable the plant to breathe.</p> <p>Share with your child the functions of different parts of the plant. Tell them there are some plants whose parts perform a different function. For example the stem of the cactus plant prepares food for the plant and not the leaves. The leaves are thorny which help to reduce loss of water and also protect the cactus from being eaten by animals.</p> <p>Roots: anchor the plant and absorb water and minerals from the soil.</p> <p>Stem: transports water and minerals from the roots to the leaves and food from the leaves to different parts of the plant.</p> <p>Leaf: is known as the kitchen of the plants. It prepares food with the help of carbon dioxide, water, sunlight, chlorophyll. Observe how the seed germinates, identify which part comes out first, find out what it is called.
