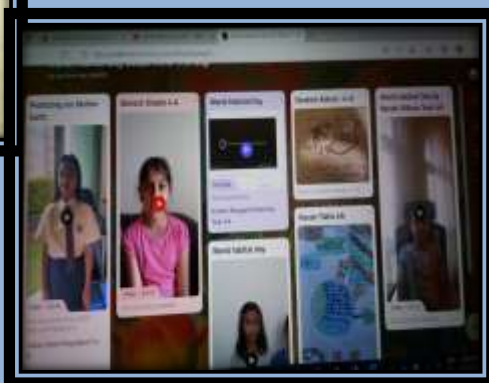
Title: World Habitat Day

Summary: World Habitat Day is celebrated annually on the first Monday of October. The event focuses on the state of human settlements and on the basic right of all to adequate shelter. It also aims to remind people that they are responsible for the habitat of future generations. World Habitat Day was established in 1985 by the UN General Assembly through Resolution 40/202, and was first celebrated in 1986.

Students of year listened to a message conveyed by **Maimunah Mohd Sharif**, Executive Director of UN-Habitat and she is a Town Planner by profession.
