Encourage them to ask questions by modelling how questions are asked. Check their understanding after reading. E.g. How do you know? What do you think? Ask them to think what the ending could be or Encourage them to change the ending of the story making it more interesting. Give them thinking time to decide what they want to say and how will they say it.

Encourage your child to explore different ways to move e.g. around, under, over and through balancing and climbing equipment. Give them instructions to follow e.g. When climbing and coming down a pole I need to wrap my legs around the pole.
