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Grammar:

Prepositions

Share with your child that the things in your room are in right places. Some items are in different positions, and you need your child's help to express the right position of the objects.

This activity takes some preparation. You will have to move some things around. For example, you could place some books under a chair, put a clock in a pan, put the fruit basket on a chair or place the CD player behind the door.

Discuss with your child the objects that have been moved around.

Encourage your child to use 'prepositions of place' to make sentences with the place of objects where they are placed.

Talk to your child about adverbs of Manner.

Discuss how Present perfect tense tells us about something that has happened at some time in the past, when that time isn't made precise.

Practice making the present perfect form of verbs, by adding a 'helping' verb (an auxiliary verb), like 'has' or 'have', to a past participle like 'left' or 'eaten'. For example: 'The monkey has escaped.'




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To represent a given data in tables, bar charts and pictograms

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To identify two different types of roots.

To investigate factors affecting plant growth.

For example the stem of the cactus plant prepares food for the plant and not the leaves. The leaves are thorny which help to reduce loss of water and also protect the cactus from being eaten by animals.

Roots: anchor the plant and absorb water and minerals from the soil.

Stem: transports water and minerals from the roots to the leaves and food from the leaves to different parts of the plant.

Leaf: is known as the kitchen of the plants. Prepares food with the help of carbon dioxide, water, sunlight, chlorophyll. This process is called photosynthesis..

Flower: helps in reproduction of new plants

Share and discuss with your child the factors which affect the growth of a plant such as sunlight, water and minerals.
