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tell the guessers that they have to make a sentence using the verb that is being acted out.

Follow the sequence of a story. Ask questions such as -What happened first, next, later, finally.

Encourage your child to highlight verbs in a paragraph and discuss which tense it has been narrated in.

Speak to your child about the use of tenses that ascertain at what time an event in the story is taking place. A compound noun is a <u>noun</u> made from at least two words.

Encourage your child with some examples of compound nouns.

Example: <u>Toothpaste</u>: a paste used in cleaning the teeth.

Schoolhouse: a building used as a school.

<u>Bedroom</u>: a room in the house where one sleeps in a bed.


Moral Education: Respecting others in the community Ask your child to match the green cards to the yellow cards.




