Alliteration

To recognise alliteration and use it in their writing.

Alliteration is when a <u>sentence</u> or <u>phrase</u> has many <u>words</u> that start with the same sound. It is a <u>tongue-twisters</u>. Basically, the first consonant repeats itself throughout the sentence.

Examples:

- 1. Go and gather the green leaves on the grass.
- 2. Please put away your paints and practice the piano.

The big bad bear and baby bunnies by the bushes.

Activity: A sound story

Pick a sound for example, let's say the sound is 's'. Then make up a story with lots of 's' sounds in.

Tell your child 'If you hear a 's' then put your hands on your heads.'


Talk to your child about the weather in Dubai, the UAE, the types of weather which are hot and cold and what they would like our weather to be like.
